Our Kindergarten students have already had a great first week of orientation, and we look forward to welcoming them back for their final sessions for this term.

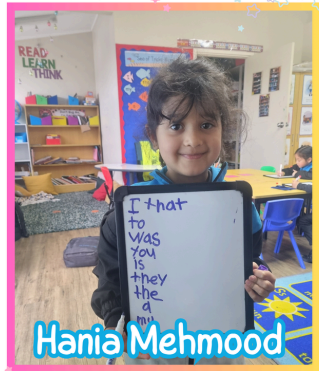
